# **Health and Wellbeing:**

#### **NHS Services in Wales:**

- NHS Wales Website: Information on GP registration, dental care, maternity services, and more.
- NHS Wales App: Book appointments, order repeat prescriptions, and view parts of medical records. (Requires NHS Login or photo ID).

# **Prescriptions:**

- Free Prescriptions in Wales: Refugees registered with a GP in Wales are entitled to <u>free prescriptions.</u>
- Cross-Border Situations: Refugees living in Wales but registered with a GP in England can get a free Entitlement Card to access prescriptions in Wales.

#### Other NHS Costs:

Other NHS costs - such as dental treatment, glasses, or travel to hospital - are not automatically free. People on a low income, including refugees, can apply for help through the Low Income Scheme Wales by completing an HC1W form or using the online checker.

#### Mental Health:

- <u>Samaritans Cymru:</u> 24/7 emotional support for anyone in distress. Call 116 123
  <u>SHOUT:</u> Free, confidential text support for mental health crises. Text 'SHOUT' to 85258
- <u>Hub of Hope</u>: Online directory of mental health services. Insert postcode to find support nearby.
- If someone is at risk of harming themselves or others, they can go to the Accident & Emergency (A&E) department of any hospital and ask for help. Support is available 24/7.

### **Maternity Entitlements:**

- Healthy Start Voucher: Families can apply online, through their midwife, health visitor, or local maternity services
- Sure Start Maternity Grant: One-off payment of £500 for the first child

# **Financial Support**

#### **Benefits:**

Everyone's circumstances are different — there is lots of advice and support available.

You can refer families to, or guide them towards, these trusted sources:

- GOV.UK Benefits: Official UK government website with the latest rules, eligibility, and application links.
- <u>Citizens Advice Cymru</u>: Free, confidential advice on all types of benefits, including Universal Credit.
- <u>Turn2UsCalculator</u>: Online benefits calculator and grant search to check what financial help families might be entitled to.
- Jobcentre Plus: Explains which benefits families may qualify for and support with applications.

#### **Charitable Grants**

Charities can provide grants that do not need to be repaid - a great way to get extra support:

- Turn2Us: Search by postcode for local charities offering grants.
- National Zakat Foundation: Support for hardship, housing, and work or education.
- <u>Family Fund</u>: Grants to families raising disabled or seriously ill children / young adults on low income.
- Citizens Advice Cymru: Help with food, energy, and other support.

#### **Basic Needs:**

- <u>Discretionary Assistance Fund (DAF)</u>: Grants for people in crisis or needing essential items (e.g., emergencies, setting up a home). No repayment required. Apply online or by phone.
- Free Items: Platforms like <u>Trash Nothing</u>, <u>Freecycle</u>, and <u>Freegle</u> offer free household items.

#### Food:

- <u>Trussel Trust</u>: 3-day emergency parcels (referral usually via Citizens Advice)
- Community programmes: Free hot meals from initiatives such as <u>FoodCycle</u> and NextMeal.

#### **Transport:**

Families on Universal Credit may get up to 50% off train or some bus fares with a
 <u>Jobcentre Plus Travel Discount Card.</u> (Discounts may vary by provider)

### **Saving Schemes:**

- Help to Save: 50% government bonus for families on Universal Credit or Tax Credits
- <u>Tax-Free Individual Savings Account (ISA)</u>

 Interest-free, Sharia-compliant banks: <u>Al Rayan Bank</u> and <u>Gatehouse Bank</u>. (Online services available in Wales)

# **Proving the Right to Work:**

Before starting work, refugees must prove their right to work in the UK. This can be done by visiting the GOV.UK <u>"Prove your right to work to an employer"</u> webpage, selecting "prove your right to work," and generating an online Share Code to share with their employer.

# **Supporting Children at School**

- <u>The Bell Foundation</u>: Resources for teachers supporting children learning English and promoting inclusion.
- IRC Healing Classrooms: Training on trauma-informed practice to support refugee and asylum-seeking children's wellbeing.

### **Adult Learning & Vocational Courses**

- ESOL Classes: Formal and informal classes help with English, confidence, and communication skills
- Functional Skills courses: Free English, Maths, and IT courses
- Open University in Wales Everyday Skills: Free online everyday English and Maths courses, offered in partnership with Welsh colleges.
- <u>Careers Wales Course Search</u>: Free local Functional Skills courses, including options from local colleges and community providers.

### **Higher / Academic Education**

- Overseas Qualifications: <u>ENIC Statements of Comparability</u> may be funded by Jobcentre Plus.
- Tuition Fees: Refugees in Wales usually qualify for home-fee status.
- Sanctuary Scholarships Many Welsh universities offer scholarships for refugees. See the STAR Network.
